FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

It was a year ago that I was in the hospital for the first time in my life. The minor surgery meant that I had to stay overnight. When it came time for the dressing change the next day, I thought that I was going to die from the intense pain. Of course my brief experience of pain was nothing compared to the chronic conditions or acute illnesses that so many people suffer each and every day. When you think of all the people in hospitals or nursing homes, and the countless others around the world who endure without any medical care, the enormity of suffering seems overwhelming.

It is no wonder then that in Jesus' time once the crowds had heard that He cured Simon's mother-in-law, they raced to bring to Him all who were ill or possessed by demons. If someone could alleviate the pain, cure the sick, and cast out demons this was definitely an opportunity of which to take advantage.

While modern medicine may help us with our physical illness and psychological pain, there is still a spiritual dimension to sickness that we should not ignore. Sickness separates us. It makes us question our faith. Illness strikes at our heart as well as our body. That is why the church offers the sacrament of the anointing of the sick for any who are ill. When we are sick, we are also alone. We need the support of the community of faith. And we need their prayers.

When a loved one is ill - or if you are sick yourself - don't hesitate to request the sacrament of anointing. If your illness confines you for a longer time, ask to receive Communion regularly to nurture you spiritually even as you seek to be strengthened physically. People sought out Jesus in this weekend's Gospel. When we or a loved one is ill, we can seek Him out today.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Before you know it, the season of Lent will be upon us. **Ash Wednesday** is **February 22nd**, and we receive the mark of blessed ashes on our foreheads, we will take our first steps on the pilgrimage of renewal which leads us to Holy Week and Easter. The forty days of Lent are intended to be a time for us to open our hearts to the grace of God by renewal reconciliation.

I often hear people commenting that the season of Lent is too long. In fact, there was a priest from our diocese who thought Lent should begin just two weeks before Easter. The priest who made this comment has since gone to his eternal reward, and I have a suspicion that from his vantage point in heaven he might think the forty days is much better than the abbreviated version he once joked about. Actually, I think the reason he wanted a shorter Lent went back to the days when adults had to fast each day of Lent, and, in all charity, this particular priest had a healthy appetite!

While I am not trying to rush the seasons of the year, it would be my hope that all of us would approach the wonderful season of Lent well prepared. We should set a goal, or better yet, a few goals for ourselves, draw a plan of what we want to accomplish during our Lenten journey, and have the proper frame of mind as we begin this holy season. Our goal should be one of renewal of self, seeking the reconciling love of God, deepening our understanding and appreciation for prayer, penance, alms giving, and good works, arriving at Easter a truly different person in mind, body, and spirit.

Our plan should include what we intend to do as far as prayer, penance, almsgiving, and good works are concerned. Whether it is attending daily Mass as often as we can, reading of scripture or other Lenten devotions, we need to do *something* that will be a daily reminder to us that this is indeed a time of special grace. Some form of penance, whether abstaining, fasting, "giving-up" of something is always good. Good works, giving of alms, works of charity, always help to sharpen the focus of our renewal. One of the most important things any of us can bring to the Lenten season is a proper frame of mind. Look at the season of Lent in a positive vein; not just as a time of giving something up, or making the sacrifice of doing something extra. Lent is supposed to be a time when the doing of these things helps us enrich our prayer and spiritual growth.

We have a little over two weeks before Lent begins, but preparation is an important part of any journey.

THE ORIGIN OF ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday entered the calendar in the early sixth century when the desire arose to have forty actual days of fasting before Easter. Sundays were never fast days, so to get to forty, one had to add four days to the six weeks of Lent. In the Christian lands along the Rhine River the devotional practice of imposing ashes arose as people imitated what they heard in Bible passages such as 2 Samuel 13:19, Ezekiel 27:30, Job 2:12, and Jonah 3:6. What was once a private devotion came to be practiced publicly in the eighth century, and by the year 1000 it was commonplace in many celebrations at the beginning of Lent. The distribution of ashes was formally added to the Missal at Rome in the thirteenth century and this ancient symbol of repentance is now widely used among most Christian denominations at the beginning of Lent.
